## WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

Each year corruption is estimated to cost about USD \$2.5 trillion, about 5% of global GDP, and adds about 10% to the cost of global business. About one trillion dollars is paid annually in bribes and political leaders loot about \$40 billion a year in their own countries. Among other things corruption hampers economic growth and performance; discourages investment; distorts natural resource development; reduces tax revenue; distorts human services and infrastructure services. It weakens judicial integrity and the rule of law and overall diminishes quality of life for all but a very small few.

This course will introduce you to the study of corruption, and through the use of examples, provide the skills to classify and understand different types of corruption. **Professor Adam Graycar** is a Professor of Public Policy at Flinders University (Adelaide, Australia) and Director of the Transnational Research Institute on Corruption at the Australian National University (ANU). Prior to joining Flinders University in 2015 he was Professor of Public Policy at the Australian National University. He brings long experience in Public Policy, both in academia and in government, as well as substantive knowledge of corruption prevention, plus considerable research skills and experience. He has a substantial publication record in corruption analysis and prevention. He has taught corruption prevention courses at the graduate level at both Rutgers University and Australian National University (ANU). He currently teaches a full semester course entitled “Corruption in Our World” at the ANU. He has served twenty-two years in government. This included work across several policy fields and included nine years as Head of the Australian Institute of Criminology (a federal government policy research agency) and four years as Head of the Cabinet Office (a strategic policy formulation and co-ordination agency).
