## COURSE DESCRIPTION

The enactment of the Malaysian Competition Act in 2010 has been a revolution of sorts in terms of risk assessment for businesses. Whilst the Malaysian Competition Commission (MyCC) has been extremely active in policing the application of competition law in Malaysia in recent years, many businesses have not understood the relevant rules and guidelines to assess the risks of breaching the law. As such, many companies and businesses have been investigated by the MyCC and breaching parties have been subjected to hefty fines in the tunes of millions of ringgits.

The aim of this course is to teach the relevant stakeholders in companies and businesses of the various types of competition law provisions in the 2010 Act and to discuss the substantive provisions and the legal tests through the case studies of the MyCC. This will assist them in having a holistic understanding as to how competition law applies in a business environment and allows stakeholders to identify the risks involved in their businesses. The course will also contain a comparative discussion with case studies from the European Union (EU) as the EU is a much more matured jurisdiction with established practices and the Malaysian Competition Act 2010 is also modeled after its EU counterpart.

- A discussion on the key provisions of the Competition Act 2010.
- Case studies and hypothetical examples focusing on how the Act applies in practice.

- Discussion of the legal tests and the MyCC Guidelines on how the assessment of breaches.
- Discussion of EU case laws in reference to the provisions of the Competition Act 2010.
